

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR RICHMOND LAYOVER

With Vancouver International Airport (YVR) located in Richmond, the city is perfect for easy-access layover visits. Check your luggage at the airport with **CDS Baggage**, located on level two of the domestic and international terminals.

LAYOVER TOUR

Walk to the Canada Line's **YVR-Airport Station**. Buy a transit DayPass (\$15) at the vending machine, then take the next Richmond-bound train that comes along.

Zip to Richmond-Brighouse Station and board a number 401, 402 or 407 bus. They all terminate in charming Steveston Village 1, under 30 minutes away. From here, it's a two-minute walk to the Gulf of Georgia National Historic Site 2, a celebrated museum exploring old-time salmon-canning (1 hour).

The nearby boutiques and cafes of Moncton Street are also worth exploring (1 hour). It's

also a short stroll to Fisherman's Wharf 3—aim for fish and chips at waterfront Pajo's (30 minutes). From here, stretch your legs on a 20-minute shoreline stroll to Steveston's other National Historic Site: fishing industry-focused Britannia Shipyards National Historic Site 4 (1 hour).

Weave back to where the bus dropped you off and hop aboard any service: they all head to Richmond-Brighouse Station. Reconnecting to the Canada Line, hop off at Templeton Station's McArthurGlen Designer Outlet 5, with its 70+ designer discount stores (1 hour).





You're just one stop from Bridgeport Station and the River Rock Casino Resort [5].
Try your luck on the gaming floor (1 hour).
Tip: McArthurGlen and River Rock are only a few stops from YVR-Airport Station if you have a short layover and are looking for fewer places to visit.

Finally, fuel-up via Richmond's amazing Asian dining scene. Alexandra Road (also known as Food Street 1) has 200+ restaurants and it's a short walk from Lansdowne Station—which means you can quickly return to the airport when required.

CANADA LINE SHOPPING & DINING LAYOVER TOUR

Walk to the Canada Line's **YVR-Airport Station**. Buy a transit DayPass (\$15) at the vending machine, then take the next Richmond-bound train that comes along. Tip: if you're only heading to either of the next two stops (Templeton or Bridgeport Station), your trip is free (select "Sea Island Only" on the vending machine screen).

Zipping from the airport, you'll reach **Templeton Station** in three minutes. Stroll

to McArthurGlen Designer Outlet 5 for high fashion without the high price (1 hour), or proceed one stop further to Bridgeport Station and test your luck on the gaming floor at the River Rock Casino Resort 15 (1 hour).

Next, continue to **Aberdeen Station** and nearby **Aberdeen Centre 6**. One of Canada's largest Asian-themed malls, it has 100+ stores, including North America's first **Daiso 7**Japanese discount store (1 hour).

The next stop along is Lansdowne Station, near Lansdowne Centre (3) mall—home to No. 9 Restaurant (12), one of Richmond's only 24-hour eateries. It's a short walk from here to restaurant-packed Alexandra Road, known locally as Food Street (11) (1-2 hours).

Next along the line is **Richmond-Brighouse Station**. It's close to **CF Richmond Centre**one of the area's biggest malls, with stores including Apple and Sephora (1 hour).

Finally, return to **YVR-Airport Station**. Fairmont Vancouver Airport Hotel is inside the domestic terminal and its **Jetside Bar** (30 minutes) is the perfect spot to toast your layover.
